

San Juan Mayor Carmen Yulín Cruz will speak at TEDxPittsburgh

Carmen Yulín Cruz, mayor of San Juan, Puerto Rico and Carnegie Mellon University alumna, will speak at TEDxPittsburgh in June, organizers announced.

“She’s been on our radar for a while,” said Chris Daley, the event’s co-organizer, who added that Cruz both has a connection to Pittsburgh and can share a lesson that’s relevant to here and to the rest of the world. She’s been a champion of building a community – while also rebuilding it, Daley said.

In September, Cruz was under an [international spotlight](http://triblive.com/local/allegheeny/12791922-74/san-juan-mayor-targeted-by-trump-has-strong-ties-to-pittsburgh) (<http://triblive.com/local/allegheeny/12791922-74/san-juan-mayor-targeted-by-trump-has-strong-ties-to-pittsburgh>) after Hurricane Maria ravaged San Juan, and President Donald Trump tweeted that Cruz had “poor leadership ability.” She responded by saying the goal was to save lives and to not be distracted from doing so.

Cruz [last visited Pittsburgh earlier this month](http://www.post-gazette.com/local/city/2018/04/02/Rosana-Guernica-Puerto-Rico-fundraiser-filmmakers-documentary-hurricane-maria-cmu/stories/201804020048) (<http://www.post-gazette.com/local/city/2018/04/02/Rosana-Guernica-Puerto-Rico-fundraiser-filmmakers-documentary-hurricane-maria-cmu/stories/201804020048>), when she attended a fundraiser for relief flights to Puerto Rico, led by CMU junior Rosana Guernica. She also spoke at a forum during CMU’s Energy Week, which was also part of the city’s Inclusive Innovation Week, the *Post-Gazette* reported.

During that visit, Cruz told *TribLive* that Trump [continued to neglect Puerto Rico](http://triblive.com/local/allegheeny/13474264-74/san-juan-mayor-blasts-trump-federal-puerto-rican-relief-effort-in-return) (<http://triblive.com/local/allegheeny/13474264-74/san-juan-mayor-blasts-trump-federal-puerto-rican-relief-effort-in-return>) after it was ravaged by Hurricane Maria.

“He (Trump) has turned his back on the Puerto Rican people, and by doing so ... that image of the president throwing paper towels at us will continue to go around the world.”

... “I don’t know what’s worse: if he doesn’t get it, or if he doesn’t care,” continued Cruz, who lived in Squirrel Hill, Shadyside and Bethel Park from 1984 to 1992. “Fortunately for us, the American people are totally different and have a totally different heart.”

“And they’ve really made sure that we feel with their actions that we’re not alone.”

It’s a small world

The theme of the 2018 TEDxPittsburgh is “small worlds.”

“They say Pittsburgh is a small world,” yet people from all fields tend to get tunnel vision in their area of expertise, Daley said. But it turns out there are many connections and overlap between different fields.

“The whole reason that we do [TEDxPittsburgh] is we think Pittsburgh’s biggest export can be ideas, when it used to be steel,” he said.

TEDxPittsburgh is an opportunity to learn about the newest ideas and innovations through one of the oldest forms of communication: a speaker, their idea, and a crowd, he said.

Often, speakers talk about an idea for the first time or about something that’s not known outside their industry, Daley said. The event features speakers from a variety of fields including tech, entertainment and design and a majority are either Pittsburghers or have a connection to the city.

It also includes performers and an interactive innovation showcase, as well as time for attendees to chat and start thinking about putting their own ideas into action.
