Basically, I have catalogs from Three Rivers Archery and several bovoyers, several books on traditional archery, and, during my recent trip to Cynagua, I was able to obtain the rules for the Inter-Kingdom Archery Competition and the Combat Standards Manual Kingdom of the West which 2inchwes information on combat archery (Of course, before any combat archery takes place, the Baronial Marshal will be consulted).

Also, I recently spoke with Pete Sherrin, the Misawa Range Safety Monitor, and he said that, as of 1 December, the archery range would be open on Fridays and Saturdays from 1000 to 1700.
