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Summertime is finally here



Ah summertime is here. It's time to relax and have fun. It couldn't get any better... Or could it? – ROLVe's first Summer Update video

Arsenal has come a long way from the first Summer Update back in 2019. Since then, Arsenal has reached 1 billion, 2 billion, and just recently, 3 billion visits. It went through 28 major updates (not including the Mr. Monky updates) which

just proves the amount of blood, sweat, and tears that have been poured into Arsenal. When it was announced that the developers were taking a mental health break, fans stood by the game and kept it alive. And we patiently waited for the Summer Update, which finally arrived July 6, 2021. So, without further-ado, let us take a dive into what's new and improved in the Summer Update.

Pre-Update

Many theories and much speculation filled the time leading up to the update. The Arsenal community was drip-fed information and sneak peeks by the Arsenal Discord *#coming-soon* channel, or by their favorite content creators on YouTube. Twitter was another source of info, although it was mainly full of surveys and polls on the state of the game.

ROLVe confirmed that the update was supposed to be released in June but it was delayed to July for unknown reasons.

New additions

Arsenal got many new additions in this update. Here is an in-depth list of all of them:

1. Weapons

11 weapons were added to Arsenal. The M249 and SCAR-L returned from Arsenal Archived.

Chord Tosser

The Chord Tosser is literally an electric guitar that shoots chords and has a manual blast jump by alt-clicking. The Chord Tosser uses the same model as the Guitar taunt (also added in

the Summer Update, both models having been designed by Bluay as he is responsible for the design of all the instrument taunt models. The model of the guitar is based on the Telecaster electric guitar.

• Cone Launcher

The Cone Launcher (or Ice Cream Launcher on the official update log) is a weapon that fires ice cream. Pressing right-click will launch all the ice cream at once in a sort of shotgun burst. The weapon was designed by Civicus despite his being mainly a map builder.

• Dual LCRs

The Dual LCRs are a dual wielded pair of Ruger LCRs. The Ruger LCR is a

double-action revolver released by Sturm, Ruger & Co.

that is notably lightweight and compact (with LCR

standing for Lightweight Compact Revolver). It was first

announced in January 2009 and the first iteration was released in June 2010.

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Development for this goes as far back as January 2021 when it was first announced by PrimeFIRE94 on his personal Twitter. The LCRs are the only revolvers currently in game that don't one shot up close to the body.

• Glock 21

The Glock 21 (simply known as the G-21 in game) is a .45 ACP model Glock designed for the American firearms market by Glock Ges.m.b.H.. The G-21s magazine holds 13 rounds.

The in-game weapon was designed by PrimeFIRE94. It is the third Glock pistol to be in-game.

• The Golden Bomb and Golden Bow The Golden Bomb and Golden Bow are variants of their respective weapons (the Bomb and Bow). There are no major differences aside from the color and the fact that both weapons demote you when you are killed by them. Both of



these are exclusive to the Hard Mode gamemode and were created by xonae.

• MG36

The MG36 is a failed machine gun variant of the Heckler & Koch G36 that never was adopted into military use. H&K no longer offer the model.



The MG36 in game has 100 round drum magazines, a fast firerate, and very tight spread making it ideal to use at any ranges. It was originally teased in the Arsenal Discord in May 2021 by PrimeFIRE94.

Model 635
The Colt 9mm SMG (also known as the
Model 635) is a submachine gun
manufactured by Colt's Manufacturing
Company, LLC, based on their M16 rifle design.
The magazine design is a copy of the IWI's Uzi's.



In-game, the Model 635 has a high rate of fire, but its spread is not very optimal for mid to long ranges.

• Trash Can

The Trash Can is a projectile weapon, in which you through an entire trash can at your enemy. On hit, it one shot kills your enemy at every range (supposing that you can hit them).

• Ultraball

The Ultraball is a weapon similar to the Superball except it can rebound and pierce through enemies. It was teased by xonae in early June 2021. It is one of a select number of weapons that appear in the Hard Mode gamemode.

• M249

The M249 Light Machine Gun (also known as the

M249 Squad Automatic Weapon [SAW]), is an

American adaptation of the FN Herstal Minimi. It is

widely used across multiple countries, but it mainly manufactured for the United States military. It is meant to be a stationary machine gun operated by an operator; however, you carry it around in Arsenal.









In-game it has a very high spread and firerate, so its most useful at close ranges. It was originally teased by devkeni in the Arsenal Discord in May 2021. It was in the Archived version of Arsenal.

• SCAR-L

The SCAR-L was created by FN Herstal in order to make a lighter version of the SCAR-H (hence the L for light). In 2004, United States Special Operations



Command (USSOCOM) put out a request for a special family of assault rifles. The SCAR system completed product testing in 2007. The first operational weapons were supplied in 2009. USSOCOM later canceled orders for the SCAR-L, and instead aimed to use the SCAR-H.

In-game the SCAR-L has relatively low damage, but high firerate and tight spread so it's perfect for short to long range encounters. It was burst in the Archived version of Arsenal.

2. Maps

3 maps were added to Arsenal, two of which are only available in private

servers.

Coastal



Coastal is the flagship map for the Summer Update. It was the only map in the Summer Update to come out in public servers. It was teased by Civicus in June 2021.

It is a Coastal town with many corridors and secret paths. The map is mostly mid-range to long-range but has some opportunity for cqc in the corridors. Coastal also has open rooftops that are easy to access, meaning you can get advantage over your opponents on the ground easily.



This also means you can pounce on unsuspecting players from the rooftops when you have the golden knife.

• Greybox

Geybox is a private server exclusive map that is limited to Concussion Mania. It has no known developer and was added under the radar with no acknowledgement by developers.

It appears to take place in space in a asteroid belt (despite its red skybox). There are two ships opposite of each other, both appear to be the same.

Shooting Range

Shooting Range is a private server exclusive map that came with the Shooting Range gamemode. According to the developers, Shooting Range was made with JOHN ROBLOX (a popular Arsenal YouTuber) in mind.

The map has an indoor shooting range and an outdoor area, both lined with dummies. In the indoor portion, there is a brick on the wall that when touched opens up a tab where you can pick which gun you want to test.

4. Melees

2 melees were added to Arsenal.

5. Kill Effects

8 Kill Effects were added to Arsenal.



6. Taunts

5 taunts were added to Arsenal.



7. Gamemodes

5 gamemodes were added to Arsenal (The original competitive mode was renamed to Legacy Competitive, with the edition of the new Competitive).

Competitive 1v1 Elo

Competitive 1v1 Elo is a separate gamemode from normal Arsenal, much like the Slaughter gamemode. In it, you get matched up with another person, and 1v1 in the new version of competitive. Currently, it is still in its alpha build.

8. Orange Team

Orange team is a content creator exclusive team that was given out to trusted content creators in the Arsenal community. It has multiple features, such as the ability to spawn the 2019 Egg Hunt boss (named Cluckling) and the ability to give out a custom creator weapon skin.





9. Votekicking

Votekicking was added to help combat the exploiter problem. By pressing "0", you can open up the votekick tab and pick a player to votekick. By doing this, it starts a vote, in which other members of the server can vote if they want to go through with the decision. (Votekicking was ultimately removed on August 4, 2021).

10. Cancelled Features

There were two main cancelled features, Stage Builder and Custom Gamemodes. According to Krystal Flynn, Stage builder was unable to be implemented due to the limitations in Arsenal's code (however, she did state that it would be added in a later update). Custom Gamemodes were also cancelled and moved on to the next Halloween Update.

11. Summer Care Package

The Summer Care Package was released on August 1 and added multiple new skins which you could win by spinning a wheel, as well as 1 kill effect.

TDS x Arsenal: What happened?



On May 12, 2020, BelowNatural posted a tweet announcing a Tower Defense Simulator x Arsenal collab. Over the following few weeks, nothing else was really said about it. Those weeks turned into months, which eventually, turned into a year. So, the question still stands, what happened to the collab? Will it ever come out? Well, recently, we have got some new information.

On June 6, 2021, JOHN ROBLOX (GDI or @GDILIVES on Roblox), posted a video on YouTube about the TDS x Arsenal event and where it is at now. A brief preview of the Delinquent Militant skin was shown, which confirms it still exists. He also talked about the Minigunner skin, which is in Arsenal and in the Arsenal Skin Creator amongst other developer exclusive skins. JOHN also said he knew how the update was going to go down last year but isn't sure about this year.

The update is most likely being worked on slowly and has been for the past year. Both games have been hard at work on multiple updates, and with Arsenal about to release the Summer Update III, this could mean this collaboration will come to fruition by then. But for now, we don't have much to go on and all that is left is merely speculation.

The great content crash: Why Arsenal YouTubers are quitting Arsenal

Recently, many Arsenal YouTubers have been quitting Arsenal. YouTubers like JOHN ROBLOX, Bandites, and TanqR have moved on to different Roblox games. This presents the question, "why?"

In his video "JOHN ROBLOX quits Arsenal", John talks about the new update, and why it wasn't the best compared to the other Summer Updates. "I'm not trying to pitch a view that this game is dead forever, there's no comeback," John said. "It's just that it is dead for now because the recent update for both players and content creators." He also talks about the fact the gamemode creator and map builder got pushed back to a later update due to limitations, and how so many things were promised, but not all delivered. Many other YouTubers share the same view and have left Arsenal including Bandites and TanqR. They've completely left Arsenal (as of the time of this writing) and have moved over to bedwars as their main game.

It could also be argued that some of these YouTubers have been getting tired of Arsenal too, not just because of the lack of new content, but because they have been playing the same game, on the same maps, with the same weapons for a long time. They will most likely return to Arsenal once a huge content drop comes, but for now, they have moved on.
