There are various Caucasoid influences in my family. Coming from both my father's and mother's sides are Spanish and likely Jewish blood. From my father's, there is likely also Portuguese. From my mother's, there is also Greek. Going back farther in time becomes more mysterious. My ancestors who spoke a Romance language, the Portuguese and the Spanish, have ancient roots from Italy and Greece (again!). The Celts were widespread in Europe before the Roman Empire. During its expansion, the Roman Empire absorbed many different peoples. In my family, there might have been influences from such countries as France, the Netherlands, and places in Central and Eastern Europe. The surname Medrano is a Hispanized Basque word, meaning "place of ferns" or "narrow plain." Anciently, the reclusive Basque people, who speak a very exotic, eerie non-Indo-European language, in Spain and France, were there since maybe the last Ice Age, much before the Roman Empire.
